

Things to know about Frisco, TX?

Frisco is a city located in Denton and Collin counties in Texas. It is also a part of the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex, and it is about 25 miles away from the Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport and Dallas Love Field. In 2017, Frisco was named as one of the fastest-growing cities in the United States. Just like other cities in the northern suburbs of Dallas, Frisco is a bedroom community for professionals that works in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. In this article, we are going to learn more about the history of Frisco, Texas, and the places you should see when you're there.

History of Frisco, Texas

Most families who went to the north Texas prairie took the Preston Trail, a trail that was initially an Indian footpath from the Red River south to Austin. Years later, the route was renamed as the Shawnee Trail, where millions of longhorn cattle were driven to markets on the north side of Texas. The trail had a ridge of white rock, which gave the cattle a dry path. With all of these activities, the community of Lebanon was established along this trail, and it was granted a U.S post office. In 1902, a line of the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway was built through the location of the community, and it helped a community grow around this train stop. With all the new opportunities, several people decided to move to the new community. This new town was originally named Emerson. However, the U. S Postal Service rejected the name because it was too similar to another city in Texas. That is why in 1904, the residents of the community decided to name their town, Frisco City, in honor of the St. Louis-San Francisco Railway. Years later, they agreed to shorten it to the name we now know today, Frisco.

Places to Go in Frisco, TX

Frisco Heritage Museum – This is a museum that is dedicated to the history of Frisco, and here you will find out the culture of the city through films and artifacts. You can also see a history replica town which has a railroad depot, jail, blacksmith shop, homes, church, windmill, school, homes, and a windmill that is set on four acres of land.
